



26th Annual Awards BBQ: The California Trolley and Railroad Corporations predecessor corporations were founded in 1982 and each subsequent year a BBQ celebrated the tremendous and ever-growing contributions by the individual volunteers to the Val-

ley community. Well over 400,000 hour of donated time, many millions of dollars in professional services and material and over \$4 million in cash have allowed CTRC to create and operate, at no taxpayers' cost, over \$20 million in community assets. This year the event was enjoyed by over 100 volunteers and friends on August 20 at the History San Jose's Kelly Park BBQ area. CTRC Board of Directors Board Meeting Minutes Pacific Hotel, History San Jose August 20, 2009

Chair's Report: (Diridon) Rod Diridon reported that he is working diligently with Councilman Sam Liccardo. Councilman Liccardo needs schematic Milpitas line to west of the creek's top bank and onto property.

Financial Report: Fitts/Diridon reported, Diridon reports that more money is being spent than bringing in. It was suggested that money could be saved if the newsletter was sent electronically with an elected officials list which Gene Martin will create. Diridon will call Shilo (sp?) for approval for a contact list.

This Action was unanimously approved.

Current Projects:

A. **Trolley Barn/HSJ** -VP Bob Schneider on the Trolley Barn Reported from worksheet.

OPERATIONS:

Lines: Kelly Park Line fully operational

Motormen: 7 Fully qualified, 1 almost, 2 in training-Diridon asked if the trolleys can run during commuting hours and have a banner or sign on the fence advertising the need for volunteers for trolley operators. Schneider was worried there weren't enough operators to do it, but will think it over.

TROLLEYS:

124 – Replacing caning on 4 seats (normal wear).

Birney - Recently replaced brake shoes.

VOLUNTEERS:

Dick Maurer – Leg problem keeps him away.

Mac Gaddis - Host once a month, but frail.

Lee Westfall – No longer Host or Motorman

Keith Baker - Attendance limited by wife's condition

Mike Brownlee - Back as Host for four months

Mike Hurley – Ready to start Motorman Training

Larry Larson - Back to do various projects

"Fred's Stash": 3 crates of Montreal PCC car parts discovered. Some went to RVJ and rest to SF Muni.

HSJ:

For the Annual Volunteer Recognition, Eric Butler has 25 years of volunteering, Chuck Ryan and Terri Schneider have 10 years, and Larry Bingham and Mike Hurley recognized for 5 years of service.

RECOGNITION:

Eric Butler will be recognized at the BBQ for his investment of 500 hours of service with a CTRC Cap to say thank you. Gene Martin will be recognized for 5,000 hours of service with a CTRC Buckle.

ARM:

Squamish, BC September 16-19. Gene Martin and Bob Schneider are attending.

B. Locomotive 2479 – Jack Young reported the total volunteer hours for 2008-2009 are 3879; 3479 hours invested in SP2479, and 400 hours put in on SP1215; with a crew size from as little at 2 to as many as 12 on Saturdays and weekdays as scheduled. Current projects for SP2479 are getting bids for material for the running gear restoration, rework on brake cylinder, and site maintenance. The current



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projects for SP1215 are cosmetic restoration which started in April still continuing with the Tender clean and paint, the replacement of the Firemen's side floor, and the cost for materials were \$720.50.

C. SCC Rail Museum – covered in Chair's Report.

D. **Happy Hollow Rail Electrification** – Covered in Trolley Barn/HSJ Report by Bob Schneider.

Diridon said large signs for stops are needed, including Rotary's.

E. Volunteers Report – Young reported on behalf of Ken Middlebrook. Young voiced the huge need for more volunteers.

Diridon suggested the need to have an epic event and write an article about it including the need for volunteers.

New Business

- A. Acquisitions Diridon mentioned Middlebrook sent out a notice about a Railroad Museum in the Midwest is closing and liquidating everything which is a target of opportunity.
- B. **Historic Heritage Commission/Grant Applications** – Diridon reported he has an appointment to talk with HHC about permits.
- C. Fundraising Efforts Diridon reported the difficulty for fundraising at this time and has asked for help. Diridon got \$25K from Rotary for a Display Case at Diridon Station for CTRC. Diridon suggests heavy display cases, something nice and durable.
- D. Volunteer Recognition/Plaque Today HHL Dedication Ceremony – Complete

Next Meeting – The next CTRC Board Meeting will be November 19, 2009 at 8:00am and the Meeting was adjourned at 4:30pm.

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LOCOMOTIVE NEWS

SP2479-

he project is focused on the running gear renewal. The bushings in the side rods will need to be replaced because the pins in the drivers were turned during the driver renewal a few years ago. The side rods and main rods are currently being surveyed. This process requires that the bushing be pressed out of the side rods and measured. The side rods are approximately 6 to 8 feet long and weight in the neighborhood of 600 to 700 pounds each. The process to press the bushing out requires the use of the biggest press in the CTRC machine shop. Once all the side rods, links and pins have been surveyed a detailed list of actions will be generated to outline the repair task for each componiet part.

In addition to the running gear renew one of the locomotive's brake cylinder required a new gasket. A new gasket was procured and installed in the brake cylinder. The cylinder was reinstalled on the locomotive and air tested.

Additional maintenance and clean up along with winterizing has been done to the locomotive. The area around the pilot and steam chest have been wire wheeled and painted. All the drivers have been covered with tarps to protect them from the weather as well as the Locomotive brake cylinders.

TROLLEY BARN NEWS

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From Bob Schneider Kelley Park Line:

The track groove on the last 750 feet of the line was cleaned by dragging a pick along it then sweeping the dirt out. The groove was there but Mother Nature filled it with dirt over 10 years. Sweeping is now a monthly maintenance item.

We now have 8 fully qualified motormen. The role of the conductor is more challenging now that we have a crossing where automobile drivers try to demonstrate their incompetence.

On a number of occasions we have run on the new line without an event being held. We have seen rider ship numbers of those days to be roughly double our normal numbers. What we're seeing is that people are riding for the journey not the destination. During the Antique Autos event overflow parking was at the Happy Hollow lot. Riders had to be turned away because the trolley was full upon arrival and no one got off. We're working on a simple fix for that. We have found that large events on the History Park Site are too crowded for safe trolley operations. Using the new line solves this problem.

In summary, the new line is a big hit with everyone.

Trolley Maintenance:

Birney – The Birney brake shoes were replaced. Because Fred designed the parts rather than use off the shelf ones, we had them cast at a nearby foundry. Fortunately we have the sand casting pattern on hand.

Car 124 – The caning on the seats is gradually wearing out, so we've started replacing bottoms or backs as needed. Finding the right materials and learning techniques is a challenge. Fortunately, a report (and CD with pictures) written by an ARM (Association of Railway Museums) member has been a big **help**.

Marv and his design crew are standing by to work cooperatively with the master planning group at Councilmember Liccardo's instruction.

Hurray to the Volunteers: The wonderful CTRC volunteers continue to rebuild locomotives, operate and maintain trolley cars and the Trolley Barn, attend the myriad meetings and discussions relating to our never-ending task and seem to enjoy every minute of the effort.
